

What To Do With Your Vaccine Card

Congratulations on receiving your vaccine! The COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card is an important medical document. Below are some simple tips for keeping the card and your personal information safe.



Have a backup. The easiest way to create a backup is to take a picture of the front and back so the information is handy just in case. According to [The Wall Street Journal](#), photographs or copies of cards can be accepted as proof of vaccination.



Store it somewhere safe. Your card is a medical record, so treat it as you would your birth certificate or social security card. There's no need to laminate the card for now, but the more you can do to prevent wear and tear the better.



Sharing the news. Feel free to share the news however you like, but do not share images of the card as it contains personal information.



Replacing lost cards. Contact the facility at which you received the card or your state's health department. If you received your vaccine in Philadelphia, call (215) 685-5488 or email covid@phila.gov to get a replacement.
